

**Samuel Beck**  
**1791 – 1845**

Samuel Beck was born in Washington Co., MD about 1791, the son of Andrew Beck (1737-1793) & Elizabeth Riddle (1740-1795.). He died 4 July 1845, buried at Newbern Christian Cemetery in Bartholomew County, Indiana. He married Elizabeth Morrison on 31 Oct 1811 in Fleming Co., KY. After her death, he married second to Martha (Davis) Vickery, 27 April 1837, in Bartholomew Co., IN.

Samuel entered service in Captain David Gooding's Company of the 16<sup>th</sup> Regiment (Porters) Kentucky Militia on 10 Sept 1814 (rendezvous point Newport, Campbell County, KY). He served for six months at Fort Malden, Upper Canada, and then was discharged on 9 Mar 1815. He was paid \$10/month for his service as a Corporal, plus \$8.33 for an allotted 25 days to travel the 360 miles from the place of discharge (Fort Malden) to his place of residence, Fleming & Floyd Counties, Kentucky.

In 1830, Samuel Beck was listed on census in Bartholomew County, IN. His household had 10 people, 1 female over the age of 70, 3 adults, 20-49 and 6 children under the age of 20. In 1840, Samuel Beck was enumerated in Clifty Township, Bartholomew County, IN, with his wife and 6 children under the age of 20.

Samuel Beck is listed in the old record for Newbern, but has no marker known at this writing. His wife, Elizabeth (Morrison) Beck, was born in 10 April 1793 in Ireland, and died Feb. 29, 1836. She is buried at Sand Hill Cemetery, which was the site of several early Catholic burials in Bartholomew Co. Samuel's second wife, Martha (Davis) Vickery, widow of David Vickery, died sometime after 1860, burial site unknown.

Samuel had six sons, but only three are known, John, William and Samuel.
